Alec has found it quite difficult settling back in the UK, after the time in Kos especially with the constant evangelism that was going on, settling back to being what you may say ordinary. He is now involved with the transportation of the Open Air Mission Bible Exhibitions. They have proved to be a great blessing over the years, as literally over the course of the year, thousands of children are reached with the gospel who otherwise would never hear.

The Kos update:

Sadly the services at the Continental Palace Hotel have now ceased. But the Greek group of believers known as the Hellenic International Christian Church of Kos are meeting at the Triton Hotel, this is very nearly opposite the Tourist Bureau in Kos town. They meet on Sundays at 11.00, the services are mainly in Greek but have an English translation, they are hoping that Babis who acts as the Pastor will be available for the Sunday services.

We have started advertising in Evangelical Times and Evangelicals Now, explaining the change of venue, and we do encourage all of you that

prayed for us, that if you do holiday or visit Kos to support our brothers and sisters there.

Sadly, at present there is no one to continue the printing and distribution of the newspaper Evangelos Fos.

Koschristianfellowship.com site, our dear brother Dave Hall who is Pastor of Pound Lane Free Church, is at present updating the site for us, and this will give you an insight and information.

The present plans for this year are that Glyn will not be returning to Kos, Alec's return will depend on two factors, whether our sister Olga will be available to return and if so whether appropriate accommodation can be found for her and Alec.

One urgent prayer request is that some of you will remember that we have mentioned a dear brother **Pastor Daniel Ling and his wife Rebecca** who became dear prayer partners to us. We received on Saturday evening an email from them telling us that on the previous Sunday the Local Authorities had entered the church and closed their gathering down. After interrogation they were informed that they would have to attend the Local Court to hear of any charges that may be brought against them. It seems amazing to us here in the West that the Court would sit late on a Saturday night and not on Wednesday as previously thought. Their congregation numbers these days is between 40-60.
